In an effort to become more environmentally friendly by helping to conserve water, the aerators on each faucet have been replaced with low-flow aerators. This not only saves water, but it also saves the school district hundreds of dollars on our water bill each month.

This is part of our larger energy conservation project we are completing with the help of Navitas. Along with water conservation, we will be saving energy with new lighting fixtures, HVAC upgrades, and other improvements.

What about the toilets and urinals?

As part of this same project, the flush valves on toilets and urinals have also been replaced with water-conserving flush valves. This means that they use less water each time they are flushed.
